RADIO CONCORD is a land based free enterprise Radio Station providing an alternative to the BBC.

Radio Concord broadcasts on 230 metres on the medium wave band every alternate Sunday afternoon.

Since the closure of all the British offshore Radio Stations in 1967 such as Radios London and Caroline, thousands of people on this island have been left with a very dull listening programme on the existing broadcasts.

OUR AIM is to be entertaining and varied in our service to listeners.

The station is run on a completely non-profit and voluntary basis, by young people for young people (if only in the mind). Radio Concord will try its best to provide a regular service with good quality sound and programme content.

Obviously we don't have to tell you the problems we face regarding the GPO which are a real hassle! It makes it necessary for us to move our location every time we want to broadcast, YOU can help us by finding a place to broadcast from, and you would have done YOUR bit for Free Radio. We need your support to keep Radio Concord and other Free Radio Stations going.

Radio Concord first came onto the air in May 1972 and broadcasted every Sunday from 11am to 3pm. In September we changed our broadcasting times to Saturday nights, midnights to 4am. Over Christmas 1972 we operated for 18 hours continuously and received reception reports from as far away as Scotland and Southern Ireland. On New Years eve, Radio Concord was raided by the GPO, which resulted in the loss of two high powered transmitters and one prosecution.

The station was off the air for a few months, but has been broadcasting again since March 1973.
